The MACA Board of Directors met June 13, 2024, at Live! By Loews Hotel, St. Louis, MO. The board took the following actions:

- Membership Chair Matt Wagner reviewed plans for the 2024 Annual Meeting.
 - o Referred sponsorship discussion to the Executive committee.
 - Set the '25 MACA Annual Meeting dates for September 2-4, 2025, in Kansas City, MO.
- Critical Member Issues Chair Aaron Deardorff reported the committee heard several presentations on key issues and the acronym list has been created.
- Education Vice Chair Mitch Reed reported the Developing Professionals (DP) the '23 model has been successful and as a result the committee is requesting nominees for the '24 class. Target group is individuals with 1-7 years' experience primarily salespeople to develop soft skills.
